SEE Connect Workshop

October 2-3, 2026 | Belgrade, Serbia

The SEE Connect Workshop is an academic initiative organized by the Academy of Management (AOM) as part of its Community Accelerator Program (CAP). This event is designed for young researchers, doctoral students, and early-career academics across Southeastern Europe (SEE) and beyond, working in the areas of strategy, innovation, technology, and organizational studies. The workshop is closely aligned with the research domains of three AoM divisions — Strategic Management (STR), Technology and Innovation Management (TIM), and Organizational Behavior (OB).

Featured AoM Divisions

STR — Strategic Management

Dedicated to advancing knowledge about the strategy of organizations and those who shape it. The division's domain spans competitive, corporate, and international strategy; behavioral strategy; strategic entrepreneurship; knowledge, learning, and innovation; strategic leadership and corporate governance; and nonmarket strategy.

TIM — Technology and Innovation Management

Encourages multidisciplinary scholarship on innovation and technological change, their antecedents and implications — from the strategic and organizational management of technology, R&D, and intellectual property to the commercialization and scaling of new technologies, platforms, and ecosystems, including emerging technologies such as artificial intelligence.

OB — Organizational Behavior

Devoted to understanding how individuals and groups think, feel, and behave in organizations — covering individual processes such as motivation, emotions, and decision-making; interpersonal processes such as trust, justice, power, and influence; and team dynamics, including leadership, composition, and collaboration.

The workshop will feature keynote talks, a CARMA methodology workshop, an editors' panel on navigating the journal review process, research presentations, and dedicated sessions with AoM division representatives. This is a unique opportunity to connect with leading scholars, form research teams, and learn from the best in our field.

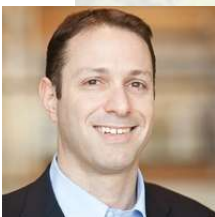

- Format: MS Word or PDF

Your proposal should include:

- Title
- Name of Researcher(s) and Affiliation
- Antecedents / Objectives / Theory / Hypotheses
- Methodology or Intervention (if any)
- Results (if any)
- Theoretical and Practical Implications, Limitations, and Future Research (if any)

We accept theoretical and empirical work using different methodologies. Selected proposals will be organized into parallel sessions, with each paper assigned an expert discussant. AoM journal editors and senior scholars will participate throughout the workshop.

When you land...

Practical information for your visit to Belgrade

We hope your time with us in Belgrade will be both successful and enjoyable. To ensure your visit is not all work, we have put together some helpful service information, along with a brief guide to the city and its top attractions.

Airport & Transportation

Belgrade City Airport Nikola Tesla is a major regional air travel hub. To get from the airport to the city center by taxi, head to the counter in the international arrivals area and pick up a voucher for a fixed-price ride (luggage included). The taxi price per ride is RSD 3,000 (25 EUR). Majority of taxis from airport accept solely cash. When you leave baggage & customs, on the left you will find an exchange office. Approximate travel time to city center: 20-25 minutes.

Taxi Service

For getting around the city, a hotel can order you a taxi. If you want to call a taxi yourself, we recommend: PINK TAXI (+381) 65 488 99 77, NAXIS TAXI (+381) 63 58 11 11, BEOGRADSKI TAXI (+381) 63 9801. You can also use apps such as CARGO (appcargo.com/en).

Currency

The official currency in Serbia is Serbian Dinar (RSD). 1 EUR is approximately 118 RSD. Visa/Master & Apple Pay are widely used. It is beneficial to have some RSD as well — around 6000 RSD (50 EUR / 55 USD) is more than enough.

Hotels

Accommodation options in Belgrade

The conference will be hosted by the Faculty of Organizational Sciences — FON, at our campus. This is in a beautiful part of Belgrade slightly outside of the city center (6 km from the Square of Republic). There are a number of options concerning hotels depending on whether you want to stay in the city center or close to the Faculty.

City Center — Slavija Square Area

One of the recommendations is that folks look for hotels around Slavija Square (it's more of a roundabout, but very centrally located). For instance, Hotel Hilton (next to the Slavija Square) is located around 10–12 min (cab drive) from FON. There are plenty of hotels between Slavija Square and Terazije Square/Knez Mihailova, such as Hotel Argo (www.argohotelbelgrade.com).

Knez Mihailova — Main Pedestrian Street

In the main pedestrian street of Belgrade, Knez Mihailova, Mama Shelter Belgrade (mamashelter.com/belgrade/) is a nice hotel as well (20 min by car to FON).

Close to the Faculty

A viable option often used by participants at conferences organized by FON is Hotel M, a 5-min walk from the Faculty.

Alternative Accommodation

AirBnB is also a viable option. We particularly recommend looking at the Dorcol District, one of the most beautiful parts of Belgrade with a lively club and restaurant scene.

- **Hotel Hilton** — Slavija Square area, 10–12 min to FON
- **Hotel Argo** — Between Slavija and Terazije
- **Mama Shelter** — Knez Mihailova, 20 min to FON
- **Hotel M** — 5 min walk from FON

- To the Museum of Nikola Tesla or the National Museum
- On a boat ride to enjoy views of Belgrade from the rivers
